Update from the Doncaster & Bassetlaw Department of Renal Medicine

The last few months have been challenging for all of us, but particularly for kidney patients who are at increased risk from COVID-19 and in many cases have been shielding.

As a team we have been working hard to provide safe healthcare for kidney patients in these difficult times. Instead of seeing people in our usual clinics at Doncaster, Mexborough, Worksop and Retford we have been doing the majority of our review appointments over the telephone. This has meant far fewer patients coming to the hospital so making it much easier for us to put social distancing measures in place for those who do need to come. All of our services are running and if you do need to come to the hospital we have measures in place to make your visit as safe as possible.

Thankfully we have so far had relatively few cases of COVID-19 in kidney patients in Doncaster and Bassetlaw. As case numbers are rising again we need to keep up all of our efforts to reduce the risk of transmission – remember hands, face and space!

We expect the coming winter to be difficult but we are still looking to the future and considering how we can learn from the events of recent months and improve our services for the longer term. We hope to be able to offer more flexible clinics in the future with suitable patients continuing to have some of their appointments by telephone or video call. This should reduce the need for travel, reduce pressure on parking at our hospital sites and provide a convenient option for many people. We are also hoping to work in a more joined up way with other departments such as the diabetes clinic, reducing the need for extra visits and blood tests.

breathe with my mask on !!! Really, they don't make them big enough for me, and don't start me on hand sanitisation, my gloves are wet through at the end of the day!



Diet Myth Busters

This information has been provided by the dieticians at Doncaster Royal Infirmary, reference from Kidney Care UK

Many of the things patients believe about a kidney-friendly diet aren't true.



Myth: People with kidney problems should be a on a low potassium diet.

Fact: Not all people with kidney problems need to follow a low potassium diet and there is no benefit to following a low potassium diet if you do not need to. You should follow the guidance of your Renal Dietitian or Renal Specialist.

Myth: People with kidney problems can't eat bananas.

Fact: If you have been advised to follow a low potassium diet by a Renal Specialist then you should limit bananas to once or twice a week. If however you do not need to follow a low potassium diet then you can enjoy bananas as part of a healthy balanced diet.

Myth: I should double boil potatoes on a low potassium diet.

Fact: This is unnecessary. Boiling potatoes once in plenty of water is adequate. But ensure that you don't use the cooking water to make and sauces or gravies.

Myth: Cooking water should be included in my fluid restriction.

Fact: Unless the water is used for a sauce, stock or gravy then it does not need to be included in your fluid allowance.



Myth: Following a low potassium diet can prevent my kidneys from failing.

Fact: You only need to follow a low potassium diet if you have been advised by a renal specialist, so enjoy a varied and healthy balanced diet including at least 5 portions of fruit and veg each day.

Myth: A low potassium diet is bad for my family

Fact: If you're struggling to provide a healthy balanced diet to your family while following a low potassium diet then please seek help and support from your renal dietitian.

Myth: Some salts are healthier than others

Fact: As with the general population we should all be careful with the amount of salt we use even if it's sea salt, Himalayan pink salt, celery salt, garlic salt etc. Instead use herbs, spices, lemon & lime juice, and vinegar to increase flavour in your food.

Introducing Kidney Beam Information kindly provided by the renal dieticians at DRI

A new physical and emotional wellbeing online platform

Kidney Beam is a new, free online platform for all kidney patients, offering movement, fitness, physical and emotional wellbeing sessions, designed especially for people living with kidney disease.

A broad team of practitioners led by Dr Sharlene Greenwood from King's College Hospital have developed the programme. Kidney Beam has a choice of live and on-demand classes led by NHS kidney professionals and other qualified instructors, some who are themselves living with kidney disease.

Kidney Research UK is funding a six-month pilot to establish the activity and to develop the classes and sessions using participant feedback to adapt and enhance the offering.



How it works



Kidney Beam gives patients the chance to take control of their mental and physical wellbeing at their own pace, with guidance (if needed), from people who understand the complexities of kidney health.

The online platform is hosted by specialist kidney professionals – from renal physiotherapists to renal counsellors – from a number of different NHS trusts and backgrounds, as well as people living with kidney disease. And it has broad appeal – it's aimed at anyone over 16, with any ability, any kidney condition, and at any stage of kidney disease.

All classes have a fitness rating so patients can choose the right one for them. At the beginning and end of the classes people can chat to each other and the instructors, building friendships which might help them stay motivated.

With free, open access, patients anywhere can sign up to the service without a referral being needed from their doctor or consultant. It is free to sign-up until the 30th November 2020.

We all go through times of worry, fear and uncertainty when facing changes in our lives - especially ones that involves our health. At these difficult and uncertain times, whilst some people prefer to make use of their own support network, others may prefer to speak with someone impartial and separate from friends and family.

You may feel you could do with some support, information and guidance but find it difficult to know where to begin.

Whether worried about dialysis options, transplantation or simply managing everyday life, our Counsellors are able to listen and offer help and support to those who are unable to access counselling services in their local kidney unit.

Free blood pressure monitor for local kidney patients

Monitoring blood pressure is one important way that patients can take care of themselves.

Blood pressure readings provide a good indicator that everything is well, or that you should seek medical advice.

One of DaBKA's most successful projects so far has been providing our local patients with free blood pressure monitors.

We have handed out almost 500 blood pressure monitors since we started the scheme around 10 years ago, an achievement which we are incredibly proud of.

Free Fistula / Transplant Wristbands for local patients

DaBKA stock silicone wristbands that patients can wear if they wish to do so. These wristbands, hopefully, will help to alert medical staff in the event of an emergency that a patient has a fistula and / or has had a kidney transplant.

We hope that this may prevent fistula arms being used to measure blood pressure, take bloods etc. And also help prevent inappropriate medication being used.

We have fistula wristbands available for left and right arms.

The sizes available are: 20cm (regular) and 24cm (large)

The wristbands are free to kidney patients in our local area



Kidney Care UK Grants

Kidney Care UK provide grants for kidney patients.

They can help with the cost of domestic bills such as car insurance and tax, heating costs, telephone installations, and TV licenses.



They may also help with the purchase of domestic goods like washing machines, fridges, freezers and carpets.

They also give grants to families and individuals towards the cost of a basic holiday in the UK or overseas. The grant can be used to cover the total cost if most, or it can be used as a contribution to the final cost of the holiday.

Grants are also available for education and training and also some travel costs.

There are conditions and limitations attached to the grants and application forms will need to be signed by your medical team.
