

Each recipe comes with a comprehensive set of Food Facts – how this recipe fits into your kidney diet; vegetarian, healthier or cheaper options and how to store it so that you can safely eat any left-overs on a day when you don't feel up to cooking. More recipes will be added over the coming months.

As with all chronic conditions, Chronic Kidney Disease affects everyone in different ways, so if you are not sure about any aspect of one of the recipes please ask your renal dietitian for advice tailored to your own needs.

This festive recipe has been provided by the Renal Dieticians at Doncaster Royal Infirmary. If you have any questions, or need help and support with your renal diet, particularly during the festive season please contact a member of your renal team..

Cranberry and white chocolate cookies (Makes 30)

150g	plain flour
½ tsp	baking powder
75g	rolled oats
125g	soft butter
75g	dark brown sugar
100g	caster sugar
1 tsp	vanilla extract
50g	dried cranberries

white chocolate chips



1 egg

100g

Preheat the oven to 180°C (356°F / gas mark 4) and line a baking sheet with greaseproof paper. Measure the flour, baking powder and rolled oats into a bowl. Put the butter and sugar into another bowl and beat together until creamy. Then beat in the egg and vanilla extract. Beat in the flour, baking powder and oat mixture, and then fold in the cranberries, and chocolate chips.

Roll tablespoonfuls of dough into balls and then place them on the baking sheet and flatten with a fork. Cook for 15 minutes until pale gold.

Leave to cool for 5 minutes to harden then cool fully on a wire rack.

A HUGE thank you to DaBKA!

I started the role of Renal Access Nurse 2 and a half years ago. The main aim of my role is to provide fluidity between the Renal and Vascular services, in order to maintain and create Renal Access for over 200 patients. It is important that our patients have their Renal Access created in a timely manner and in accordance with their kidney function. Working across two departments can be challenging at times and as a specialist nurse I am always looking for ways in which we can improve our services.

Just over a year ago, I was introduced to a Regional Quality Improvement programme called MAGIC -Managing Access and Generating Improvements in Cannulation.

MAGIC is a quality improvement project designed by the British Renal Society's Vascular Access special interest group (BRS VA) and the Vascular Access Society of Britain and Ireland (VASBI), supported by the Kidney Quality Improvement Partnership (KQuIP). The aim of the project is to Improve our cannulation in Fistulas and Grafts and to improve patient experience as a whole.

Earlier this year the BRS VA and VASBI released best practice for cannulation in renal access guidelines, the project is designed to promote a more unified practice based on their recommendations. As a department we have been collecting baseline data and meeting as a region to share ideas and to learn more about the quality improvement process.

The project is very much in its early stages but we are working closely as a team to make changes and I can see that we are already thinking differently about the way that we manage our patient's access.

The project has given me confidence to drive forward other improvement Ideas which I have previously struggled to authenticate. I've been working closely with Dr Stott (Lead Renal Consultant), Sister Starbuck (Renal Outpatients Manager), Mr Haldipur (Vascular Consultant Renal lead) and the Haemodialysis managers, to improve our services. I feel in the last year we have made huge progress.

We have a shared vision, that in the not so distant future, the majority of our staff who cannulate Renal Access will be experienced in using ultrasound to support their practice. We have provided ultrasound training to a large proportion of our staff previously, but we have found that despite this, we haven't managed to sustain the service which we believe is due to lack of equipment.

Often in the NHS, we have to make changes with only the resources that we have available to us but we are very privileged to have the support from our local charity DaBKA.

DaBKA are very supportive towards our quality improvement ideas, working tirelessly to provide the right assistance to both patients and staff .

We are very pleased to announce that with the donations that you have given to DaBKA (DaBKA have contributed £25,000) and the Local Trust Fund we have been able to purchase 3 new ultrasound machines for Doncaster, Bassetlaw and the Dearne Valley Dialysis Unit so that, in the not so distance future, we will be able to provide a constant ultrasound guided service to all our haemodialysis patients.

KQuIP have also launched an e learning tool to enable all our staff who cannulate to be up to date with their practice, which all staff are in the process of completing.

Sister Starbuck has also made improvements within the outpatients department to collaborate the Peritoneal Dialysis team with the Renal Access Nurse role to provide a rather unique service to the Renal patient population. Our team is much more dynamic and has already shown to be providing a greater support to both staff and patients.

NEW Information and Support Group Meetings at Doncaster Royal Infirmary

Often people attend the renal replacement therapy information clinic and feel overwhelmed by the amount of information about dialysis and Transplantation.

They may be quite worried, even scared about their health and their family and working life. All these factors mean that listening to me explaining treatments and giving written information to take home to read through may not be enough to enable them to feel they have 'covered every angle to consider'.

Treatment is discussed at most clinic visits through that persons journey up to dialysis or transplantation but actually having contact with people who are having dialysis treatment or have had a transplant is something that we have been keen to establish and promote more.

The first (of many) Information and Support group meetings will start in October 2019 and will be aimed at people who have attended the information clinic and need more information, guidance and support.

People attending the group will be able to see Haemodialysis and Peritoneal Dialysis machines set up and working and also see, touch and feel products related to dialysis treatment.

As well as many members of our wonderful team, Renal Consultant, Specialist nurses, Home haemodialysis training Sister, Renal dietician, and Renal admin manager with 'Patient View'. There will be 'Expert Patients', people with experience of all treatment options to answer questions and give advice and support.

Dabka will also be present with their support and have kindly funded the refreshments for the session.

Kidney Care UK Grants

Kidney Care UK (formerly known as British Kidney Patient Association) provide grants for kidney patients.



They can help with the cost of domestic bills such as car insurance and tax, heating costs, telephone installations, and TV licenses.

They may also help with the purchase of domestic goods like washing machines, fridges, freezers and carpets.

They also give grants to families and individuals towards the cost of a basic holiday in the UK or overseas. The grant can be used to cover the total cost if most, or it can be used as a contribution to the final cost of the holiday.

Grants are also available for education and training and also some travel costs.

There are conditions and limitations attached to the grants and application forms will need to be signed by your medical team.

Free Blood pressure monitor for local kidney patients



Monitoring blood pressure is one important way that patients can take care of themselves.

Blood pressure readings provide a good indicator that everything is well, or that you should seek medical advice.

One of DaBKA's most successful projects so far has been providing our local patients with free blood pressure monitors.

We have handed out over 300 blood pressure monitors since we started the scheme around 5 years ago.

Free Fistula / Transplant Wristbands for local patients

We stock silicone wristbands that patients can wear if they wish to do so. These wristbands, hopefully, will help to alert medical staff in the event of an emergency that a patient has a fistula and / or has had a kidney transplant.

We hope that this may prevent fistula arms being used to measure blood pressure, take bloods etc. And also help prevent inappropriate medication being used.

We have wristbands available for left and right arms.

The sizes available are: 20cm (regular) and 24cm (large)

The wristbands are free to kidney patients in our local area (or £1.50 each including postage and packaging if you are not in our local area).
